CL&R UPDATE

CLR UPDATE from the VVPOA Board

Current total ballots received per unit are close to 50%. As of right now it looks like we will not make the 67% needed. If Unit One does not pass, only one month of the assessment for fiscal year 2022 can be collected; that is if everyone pays. If Unit Two does not pass, only six months of the assessment can be collected; again, this is if everyone pays. This will put us in financial bind.

As a result, we have to make some very difficult decisions. We need to be fiscally responsible and maintain the property and basic services until we figure out our next step. Mohave County has been approached several times about taking over the amenities; they have not showed any interest. They recommended that we go the route of the Special District which is about a 2-year process. The county recommended a Special District consultant to lead us through this process. The Board will meet with this consultant to learn the steps we will have to take.

It is with a heavy heart that we had to make some difficult decisions.

Starting April 1st, the restaurant will be going to counter service only with a smaller menu, shorter hours and only one employee. We will try and see if this works. The other options are leasing out the restaurant or closing the restaurant, we are trying not to have to close.

The Compliance & Architecture Committee members have been working diligently to address violations and investigate complaints from community members. They have also been working with various contractors/builders to obtain required documentation for the files. This work will continue as long as the CLRs are in place. However, upon expiration of CLRs for Unit 1 on May 18th, the committee will no longer be able to enforce the CLRs there. The same holds true for the expiration of CLRs for Unit 2 on November 1st; in fact, at that time the committee may no longer exist as the majority of Valle Vista Crier

members live in Units 1 & 2 – this will be clarified with the VVPOA attorney.

Mohave County zoning code requires that any residential construction in Valle Vista be single family (except for certain lots in Unit 1) and stick built. Valle Vista will not become another Butler or Birdland. Until or unless the zoning code changes, there will not be mobile or manufactured homes in Valle Vista.

Any complaints or concerns regarding everything currently covered in the CLRs will have to be directed to Mohave County and/or the sheriff's office. There will be no community oversight for type of fencing, size or numbers of outdoor sheds, weed/abandoned or inoperable vehicle abatement, livestock and the like. No VVPOA building permits will be required as each unit expires. Anything that is allowed in unincorporated areas of Mohave County will be allowed here. The committee asks that our neighbors vote on this important matter. They also want you to know they will work hard, if the votes are successful, to help rewrite the outdated CLRs into something relevant to the vision of Valle Vista today.

Park and Pool will also be affected. Assuming the CLR renewal vote does not pass for Units 1 & 2, the board has decided the pool will remain closed for the summer. Besides the daily operating costs to keep the pool open, the pool cover needs to

be replaced and without the support of assessments from Units 1 & 2, funds will not be available this year to open and/or replace the pool cover. Maintenance costs run approximately \$10,000 or more per year and a pool cover will cost more than \$6,000. These are not expenses that the POA can currently incur.

Pool maintenance will be needed for the summer, even with the pool being closed. Volunteers will provide the labor and the POA will supply the chemicals needed for maintenance.





Library News by Diane Druian

Thinking about the month of March calls Saint Patrick's Day and the Irish to my mind so I'll take this opportunity to introduce you to Sister Fidelma, the main character in an interesting series of mystery novels set in 7th century Ireland. In addition to the usual ingredient of a crime to solve, the books include a great deal of history. This is not surprising given that the author is Peter Berresford Ellis, a noted Celtic historian who uses the pseudonym Peter Tremayne as author of some of his works of fiction.

Fidelma was born into the royal family of Munster in the late 630s. Her father, King Failbe Fland, died c. 637/9, during Fidelma's infancy. She was raised as an Eoghanachta dynasty princess. She studied civil and criminal law, especially the brehon laws, under the supervision of Brehon Morann of Tara. She eventually qualified as an anruth, the second highest rank after an Ollamh in the Irish legal system. In the novels, she pursues a career as a dalaigh, or advocate to the Brehon Court of Ireland and is also a nun or religieuse and a former member of the community of St. Brigid of Kildare.

With no modern forensic team to gather DNA, blood traces and fingerprints, Sister Fidelma uses her legal knowledge, her powers of observation and her understanding of typical human behavior to solve murders. And along the way the reader is learning the history of Ireland and exploring many themes and conflicts, such as the role of women which was much less restricted in Ireland than in other countries and the disagreements between the Celtic Church of Ireland and the Roman Church about liturgy and ritual. Ireland in this time period was not in the Dark Ages but undergoing a "Golden Enlightenment" and "Students from every corner of Europe flocked to Irish universities to receive their education, including the sons of many of the Anglo-Saxon kings." (From an article called Fidelma's World written by Tremayne on the web page of the International Sister Fidelma Society.)

While I enjoy the historical aspects of the books, the reader doesn't have to absorb how



I did not get to start this series with the first book but I found that Tremayne succeeds in making each book stand on its own with sufficient explanation and repetition to help the reader understand Sister Fidelma's rank and the position that qualifies her to examine the crimes that are the central focus of each mystery. To find the order of books in this (or other) series, go to the library website at <u>www.mohavecountylibrary.us</u>. On the left side of the screen move down and click on "Learning and Research". In the drop-down menu, choose "Books, Authors and Writing". Click on "NoveList Plus". Use your library card number as your Patron ID to log in. Then you can enter an author name in the search space and find books by that author in date order from most recent to oldest. Mohave County libraries own nineteen Sister Fidelma books. There are thirty-two in the series and another scheduled for release this year.


